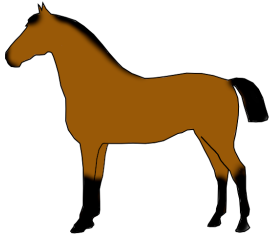
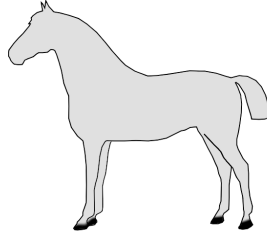


Bay



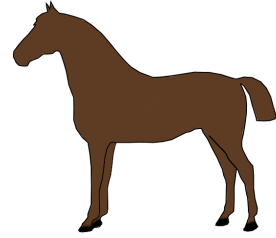
- Body colour may be varying shades of brown and red
- Black mane, tail, and points (e.g. legs)

Grey



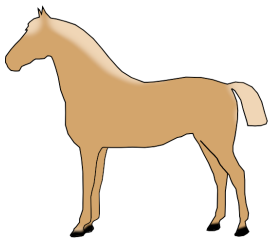
- Body and mane/tail colour are varying shades of white and grey
- “True white” is “cremello”, that has unpigmented skin
- Variations include dapple, steel, flea-bitten

Chestnut



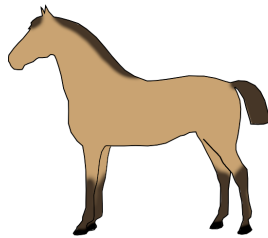
- Body colour may be varying shades of brown and red
- Mane and tail are similar colour to body colour

Palomino



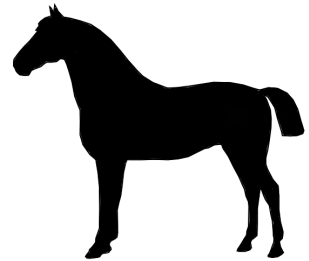
- Body colour is tan/yellow/gold
- White/cream mane and tail

Dun



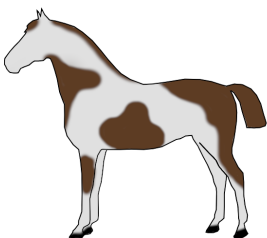
- Tan/yellow/gold body
- Black mane, tail, and points (e.g. legs)
- Similar to buckskin, but buckskin has dorsal stripe, zebra stripes, etc.

Black



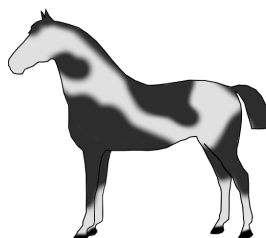
- Completely black with no brown points (allowed white markings)

Skewbald



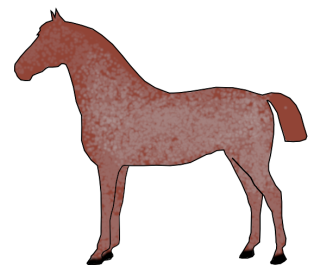
- Brown and white patches
- May be called “coloured”

Piebald



- Black and white patches
- May be called “coloured”

Roan



- White hairs evenly distributed throughout hairs of other colour
- E.g. red roans (white with brown), blue roan (white with black)
